Levels of Support

At PMS, we meet the needs of all pupils through excellent teaching and learning, providing a fully scaffolded curriculum and personalising the learning experience.

QUALITY FIRST TEACHING

Universal Support

This is the delivery of high quality, inclusive teaching taking into account the needs of all learners.

Universal Plus/Targeted Intervention

This is for those pupils who may require some additional support in order to maintain the expected levels of progress. The majority of this support takes place in lessons. A few small groups of pupils, who need specific support, attend additional interventions.

Highly Personalised Support/Intervention This is highly individualised support for a minority of pupils who require highlytailored interventions and a personalised curriculum in order to achieve their potential. This usually means an EHCP.

The Graduated Response

At PMS, we use this system to: assess pupil's needs; write individual pupil passports; write personalised targets; plan for those outcomes; evaluate them in a regular cycle. The majority of this support takes place within subject lessons.



SEN Support

For those pupils who, despite targeted support, are still making little or no progress, PMS may invite professionals from outside agencies to come into school and offer advice from their field of expertise. This would be done only with parental permission and the outcomes would also be shared with parents.

EHC Plans

Some pupils' need for highly tailored, long-term support may require applying for an **Education**, **Health and Care Plan** through the Local Authority.

4 Areas of Special Education Need (SEN)
